Britain's most invasive non-native plant has been seen growing in rough ground in Newcourt (see top photo). It was reported by residents and has been treated.

Japanese Knotweed was originally brought from the Far East as an ornamental plant by the Victorians. It is now widely naturalised. It causes damage to buildings and roads, is difficult to control and expensive if ignored. It smothers native plants, and spreads rapidly.

Japanese Knotweed spreads in several ways: the crown survives drying or composting and rapidly produces new canes when coming into contact with soil or water; tiny fragments of the underground stem (rhizome) can grow into a new plant; and even small broken pieces of stem will grow.

All parts of the plant are legally controlled waste and must be disposed of correctly. It is an offence to cause it to spread into the wild.

This will be a fantastic opportunity to meet



## School in September 2016

The school (a Church of England Voluntary Aided primary school) will provide two forms of entry with 420 pupils across seven year groups (30 per class). It will also include a Nursery for 26 three/ four year olds and 8 two year olds. It will be sited

in the area east of Greenacres at Seabrook Orchards. A Project Steering Group has started meeting and an Interim Governing Body formed with representatives of the local community, local Church of England parish, exhead teachers, experienced governors and Diocesan Board of Education officers. 
