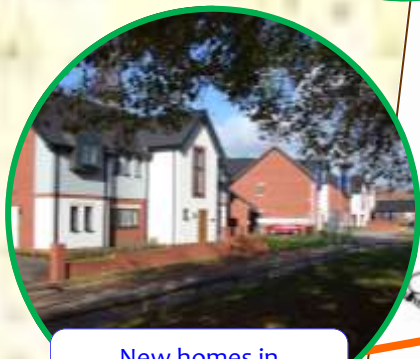

Anyone left-handed?

There is no further news on Cabinet 2 which feeds Rydon Lawns, Rydon Place and Holland Park.

Newcourt's road adoption working group update

During August and September, the adoption working group used an online survey to help understand the adoption-related issues that matter most to Newcourt residents. Over 300 residents participated in the survey, identifying issues on topics such as speeding, parking, heavy vehicles, pet waste and litter.

The working group members analysed the survey responses and developed an initial set of 9 proposals, selected because they address the issues that received the highest numbers of survey responses, and/or because they should be uncontentious with residents and relatively straight forward to implement. The trustees endorsed the proposals at the end of October, the next step is to arrange

meetings with the city and county authorities to present the proposals and discuss how to proceed.

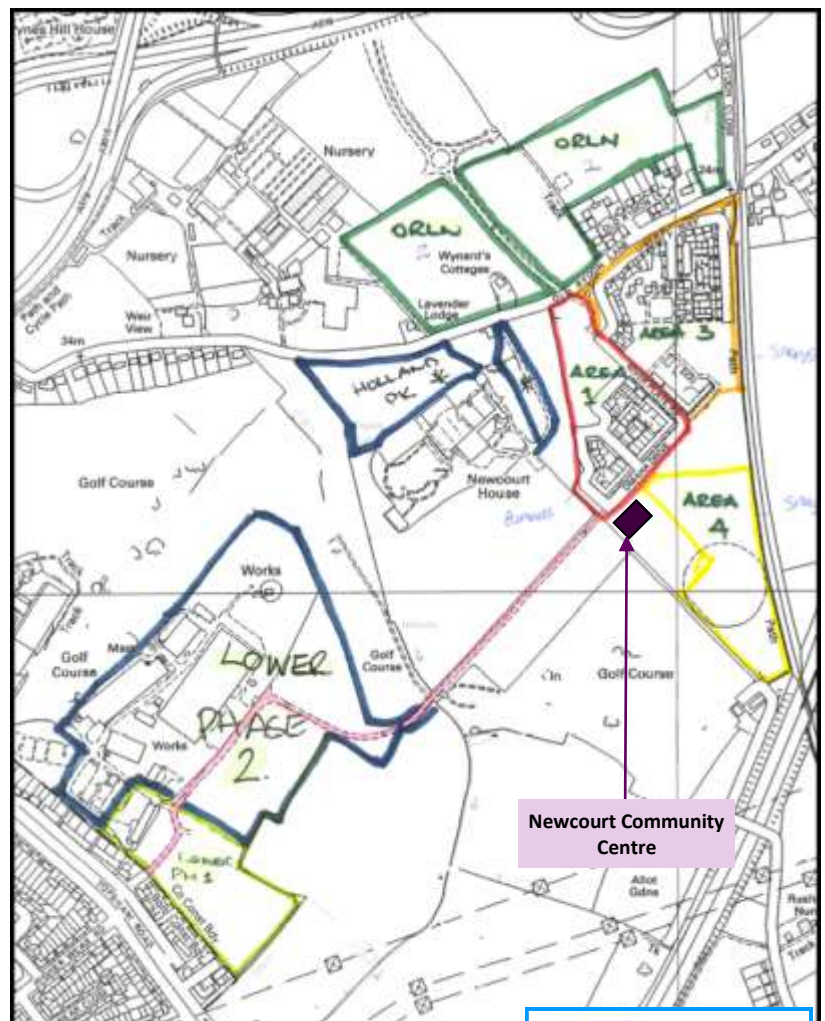
Some of the issues raised by residents were considered to be outside the intended scope of the working group. They have been referred to the Trustees to see if they can offer residents any support or self-help guidance, such as who to contact about abandoned vehicles, anti-social behaviour, or enforcing restrictive covenants.

This is the current adoption status of the roads in Newcourt:

Rydon Lawns/ Place (ORLN)	Both phases of this are under agreement, small amounts of work are still required before it can be adopted.
Holland Park	Currently under agreement.
Area 1	This has been adopted.
Area 3	Currently under agreement; the developer needs to carry out some work before it can be adopted.
Area 4	Currently under agreement; the developer needs to carry out some work before it can be adopted.
Lower Phase 1	Currently under agreement.
Lower Phase 2	Currently under agreement.
Lower Phase 2	Admiral Way from Topsham Road to Vernon Crescent has been adopted.
Spine Road	The spine road between Area 1 and Lower Phase 2 has no agreement.

advice on completing job applications and creating an effective CV as well as giving you tips and support in getting ready for interviews.

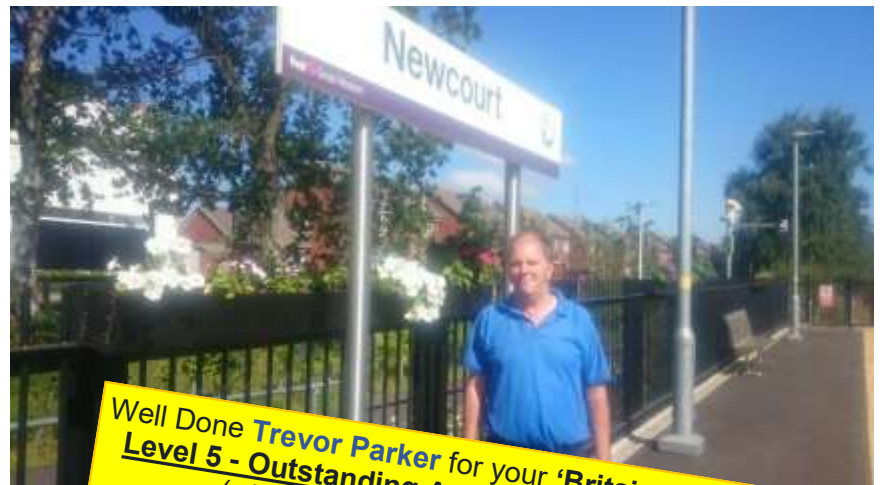

IKEA Working Group Update

The IKEA working group concluded its activities in October, after conducting a comprehensive review of the approved planning documents, including the transport plan, having several conversations with planning and highways officers, and supporting a trustees' meeting with the new IKEA store manager.

The working group believes that, despite the planning documents indicating that there will not be a traffic problem for Newcourt residents caused by customers visiting the store, it is very likely that the planners have underestimated the traffic volume that will be experienced at Newcourt, particularly when the store

first opens, during promotional events, and on match days.

Nothing will be done until the new store opens and the extent of any traffic problem is understood, but the IKEA store manager has committed to working with the NCA and local authorities to minimise any negative impact on Newcourt residents.
