Welcome to the third edition of Newcourt News! - the newsletter from the Newcourt Community Association. If you've recently moved in, a special welcome to Newcourt. We're half-way through our second year as a Community Association and grateful for you (since you live here) for being part of it! We appreciate the can-do spirit of many residents who've been working together to get us connected, being good neighbours and helping to make this a great place to live - whether by litter-picking, bulb-planting, organising picnics, carols on the green, getting the neighbourhood watch scheme going, or campaigning to get the J Bus running. And there's plenty of opportunities for you to get plugged in to help make more things happen!

Persimmon have nearly finished the Community Centre, which will be owned by the City Council. A dozen residents looked round it in May. It's looking good, though we are disappointed that there is no space for any indoor racquet games (except table tennis). Also, some crucial modifications are needed (like open access to the kitchen) before it can be used. Several groups of residents have been preparing: to hire a Centre manager, to sort out a bookings process, to secure charitable status for the NCA, and much else. In this preparatory work, the Council have been very supportive. Once the building is up to standard, the Community Association can sign a lease and take over the running of the Centre, with the help of a grant from the New Homes Bonus Scheme.

Though for parents, grandparents and children, the Play Park is much more important! 21 months ago, the Council showed residents drawings and pictures of the play equipment proposed. Now two summers on, we are still waiting for this to be installed; which the City Council and Persimmon are legally committed to provide. It should have been one of the first amenities they put in. The council is apparently waiting for Persimmon to pay installation costs (106 Agreement states £100,000). We feel strongly that the Council should do more than wait, and are seeking to impress both the Council & Developer that residents' patience is running thin.

Some residents have asked if the Council are going to provide a fenced games area (MUGA). It appears that land *has* been earmarked; but it will take a few years for the Council to collect money from the developers for it.

The committee will continue to be creative in our initiatives with the Council and the developers, and we appreciate your support and involvement in the initiatives the committee makes on your behalf.




