News from Sandy Park

Premiership Rugby is set to serve up a 'Christmas Cracker' at Sandy Park when Exeter Chiefs play host to Westcountry rivals Bath on Christmas Eve (3pm).

In one of the stand-out fixtures on the domestic calendar, Rob Baxter's side are set to run out to a capacity crowd in what should be a mouth-watering encounter.

Ahead of that game, however, there is a feast of action for both the men's and women's teams over the coming two months.

This includes the start of the Premier 15s campaign for the women's team, who will entertain Gloucester-Hartpury in their opening fixture on November 11 (3pm).

Susie Appleby's side came up just short in their

first-ever final last season, but hopes are high they will go one better this season, especially as they welcome back their 17 stars who have been featuring in the Rugby World Cup in New Zealand.

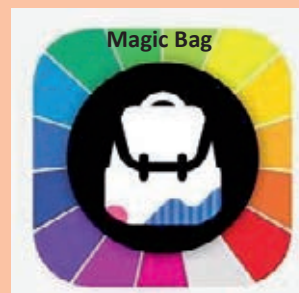

TOP TIP - Save money on your shopping by downloading these FREE Apps

OLIO is **super easy!** It lets users share surplus food locally to fill a need within the community while promoting a sustainable future. To make an item available, simply open the app, add a photo, description, and when and where the item is available for pick-up. To access items, simply browse the listings available near you, request whatever takes your fancy and arrange a pick-up via private messaging.

Magic Bag is very similar. As soon as you've downloaded the app, you can begin searching for food businesses in your area that have surplus food to sell in a 'magic bag'.

Buy a 'magic bag' from one of them and you'll be given a collection time in your in-app receipt. Once your collection window has started, you can activate a button and 'swipe to redeem' in the store where you pick your bag up. Pick up exciting delicious surprises!



LYN Love Your Neighbour community food boxes



Filled with surplus food items from local supermarkets by community volunteers...

LYN Box 1 is in the right side passage of Newcourt

Community Centre, behind the high brick wall. **LYN Box 2** is at Trinity School - left of main door.

Food collections are deposited daily in the boxes. Daily updates are put on the LYN Facebook Group with photographs, and occasionally on Trinity Facebook Group.

On Sundays and Mondays there is usually chilled food - offered in short time slots for residents to collect. For more

As it says on the box lid: **'Whatever your reason, please help yourself and in turn, help minimise food waste.'**

LYN volunteers do their best to remove any items that go past their 'use by' date. Please follow advice on the box to check all products before consumption. Any items taken at your own risk.

There is often a glut of apples at this time of year! Get the kids involved, and try these simple recipes. Warming Treats on Winter Nights - Share them with your neighbours!



Spice Baked Apples

Ingredients

- 4 - 6 apples - cored
- ½ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- ½ cup raisins ½ cup of brown sugar
- ¼ teaspoon ground cloves- optional
- ½ cup chopped nuts—optional
- Knobs of butter

Method Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees

C). Grease ovenproof dish. Mix sugar, cinnamon, nutmeg and cloves. Stir spice mixture together. Layer the middle of the apples with raisins, nuts, spice mix and tiny knobs of butter. End with a butter top. Bake in preheated oven for 45 to 60 minutes, or until soft and bubbly. Allow to cool slightly before serving. Lashings of cream, custard or ice-cream Yum!



Or try Mini-Tarts

Roll out discs of pre-made pastry. Slice apples, brush with butter and sprinkle with sugar. Bake for 15mins on 425F *add cinnamon or brush with apricot jam. Double Yum!*

Seabrook Orchards Residents' Group (SORG) News

Now 15 months old, SORG has a mailing list of 150 households, and a website on the way. Newly co-opted members have brought extra management consultancy and civil engineering experience to our Executive.

Ultimately we expect Seabrook to comprise up to 700 homes, half of which are yet to be built. Roads in Phase 1 have been resurfaced, but are yet to be adopted. A children's playground, and a Co Cars/Co Bikes station on Dart Avenue are both now operational.

Current building work on Phase 2a is almost complete, but we then expect a delay pending proposed undergrounding of the power line crossing Phase 2b.

Phase 3 will comprise "Seabrook Square" hopefully including a community hall and café. Eventually Seabrook will include a wide range of communal facilities, including Seabrook Square, streamside walk, children's play areas, M5 sound barrier, sports pitches, and allotments. SORG is working to seek clarity on timescales and responsibilities for these "managed areas". We have had meetings with Michael Dart of Seabrook Orchards Management Company and with our Topsham Councillors, and have corresponded with

Bloor Homes and Exeter City Planners.

Current issues of concern include:

- The M5 sound barrier. We are in discussion with Exeter Planners and Bloor about the lack of required tree planting.
- The strip of land preventing vehicular access between Vernon Crescent and Fish Street. We are seeking a dialogue with the owners of this "ransom strip".
- Communal "Managed Areas". Local residents need an effective voice in decision making about these facilities.
- Financial compensation for non delivery of a Seabrook health facility. Will this be ring fenced for health services in the Topsham/Glasshouse Lane area?

Thank you to the NCA, local Councillors and many residents who are helping us speak for the local community. 14 ways to take positive action Words by Gavin Haines

Warnings of record temperatures and raging wildfires in Europe, many people are asking – what can I do about climate change? More than you think, perhaps!

Ordinary people can also do their bit to mitigate warming. Listed below are 14 things you can do to shrink your carbon footprint, hold polluters to account and save yourself from climate despair.

1. Switch to a green bank Doing something as simple as switching to a green bank can have a big impact. “A significant amount of finance for the fossil fuel industry actually comes from the banking sector, with many UK household banking names among the worst perpetrators,” explains Adam Scott, corporate partnership manager at Friends of the Earth. “As of September 2019, nearly £150bn had been invested in fossil fuels by UK banks since the Paris agreement.”

2. Change your diet Research suggests that cutting back on meat and dairy is the single biggest thing people can do to reduce their impact on Earth.

3. Join an environmental group As the saying goes, there is strength in numbers. So consider joining a campaign group to add weight to ongoing efforts to lobby policy makers to slash emissions.

4. Go with a green energy provider Switching to a green energy provider is another simple but effective way of reducing your carbon footprint. One such

company is Good Energy, which buys 100 renewable electricity from independent generators and sells it on to customers.

5. Use energy wisely Being a smarter consumer can make an awful lot of difference. Setting timers for appliances to run through the night, when demand is low, or during the brightest part of the day, to utilise solar, can help. Other ways to conserve energy include switching televisions off overnight and turning the heating off when out of the house. Having a smart meter installed can help you keep tabs on energy consumption.

6. Embrace active travel Embracing walking and cycling is good for your health, as well as the planet. For longer journeys, consider taking the train. Consider investing in a rail card, which unlocks reduced fares.

7. Shun the skies Until battery and hydrogen planes bring us the possibility of guilt-free air travel, consider flying less – or not at all.

8. Find out what’s going right Keeping abreast of the good things that are happening builds resilience, and allows people to stay positive and proactive.

9. Buy local, seasonal and ideally organic You don’t need a climate scientist to tell you that seasonal produce, grown locally, and to a high environmental standard is better for the planet than items shipped halfway around the world from companies with murky supply chains. If you can afford to go organic, it’s a worthwhile investment – organic farms support much more wildlife

than those relying on fertilisers and pesticides.

10. Grow your own Whether you have a windowsill or a smallholding, growing your own herbs, flowers or vegetables can be beneficial.

11. Buy secondhand Manufacturing products is often a carbon intensive process, and uses up precious natural resources.

12. Choose a sustainable pension fund “Investing in your pension more sustainably could be 27 times more powerful than going vegan and stopping flying combined,” says Henna Shah from Make My Money Matter, a campaign group that highlights what people’s pensions are funding. The Resolution Foundation calculates that private pensions are the largest component of household wealth in the UK, totalling over £6.1tr.

13. Switch insurers Insurers are the second biggest investors after pension funds, so choosing an ethical insurance company will ensure your money isn’t propping up the fossil fuel sector.

14. Vote for parties with strong environmental policies Elections don’t come around often. But when they do, spend some time going through the manifestos of the parties that are standing. Look at what environmental policies they support and their environmental record. Vote for the party or candidate that you think has the most credible roadmap to net zero. 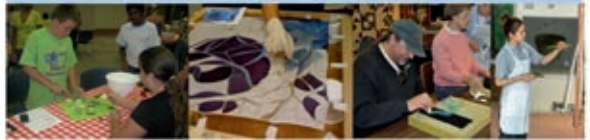

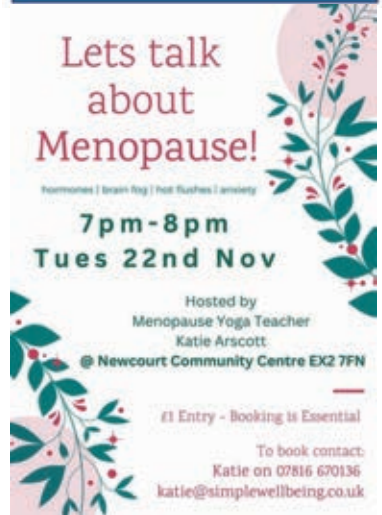

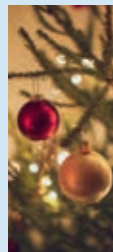
